



Spring 2020 Newsletter

Dear WUSA families: As we reflect on the spring season's abrupt end and the numerous challenges our community and league face in the months to come, we all share a sense of loss and concern. Because of this, it is all the more important that we consider the status of the league leading up to this unprecedented event and remind ourselves what we can look forward to as we remain hopeful for a return to play in the coming months.

Our 2020 spring season saw the largest number of participants in our league's history. The 844 active participants this season were a compelling indicator that WUSA continues to provide a premier outlet for girls youth softball and community engagement in the region. Our spring season boasted 224 players in our entry-level, 6U division. With this youthful energy in the on-deck circle, WUSA is positioned to continue its remarkable growth into future years.



Specifically, our league's intentional efforts at striking the right balance of safety, fun, skill development and competition in an environment promoting sportsmanship have been keys to our success in addition to our top-notch facilities. Support of an active, energetic Auxiliary hosting numerous of our very fun off field events is another key element to the well-rounded WUSA experience. The season kick-off Parade & Carnival, the Father-Daughter Dance, as well as the Adult Social for parents are just a few of the Auxiliary-supported events celebrated in the traditional spring season. The 2020 Father-Daughter dance was a showcase of the growth and excitement in the league.

On behalf of all our WUSA families, the league provided a stipend to each of our umpires in recognition of their value to our league and to help them during these difficult times. In total, WUSA's donations to our umpires totaled approximately \$6,000. One of the notes of thanks we received is worth sharing and sums up so much of what our league is about.

Facilities Updates:

Game Cameras added to McGovern Field

WUSA continues to invest in upgrades to our facilities enhancing the on-field

and off-field experience.

New this spring season, we added a game camera at our McGovern field in addition to existing cameras added last spring to our South Campus facilities. Now friends and



families can watch games live if they can't be there in person and even download video clips of those special memories of their player from archived games. Information regarding the website and login information are shared with team managers each season, so be sure to contact your team's manager to receive the gamecam login password for the season.

South Campus Upgrades

As mentioned in previous newsletters, WUSA is advancing plans, albeit cautiously given the uncertainty with COVID-19, to upgrade our South Campus facilities to support our robust growth and ensure that we continue to showcase the best softball facilities in the Houston area. Planned updates include addition of more dedicated warm-up space for pre-game throwing and pitching. The space will provide more safety to players and spectators.

Expansion of the concession building and the addition of a shaded pavilion will provide much needed increases in covered shelter and restroom facilities to keep pace with our league's growth.
